Working together to end sexual violence.

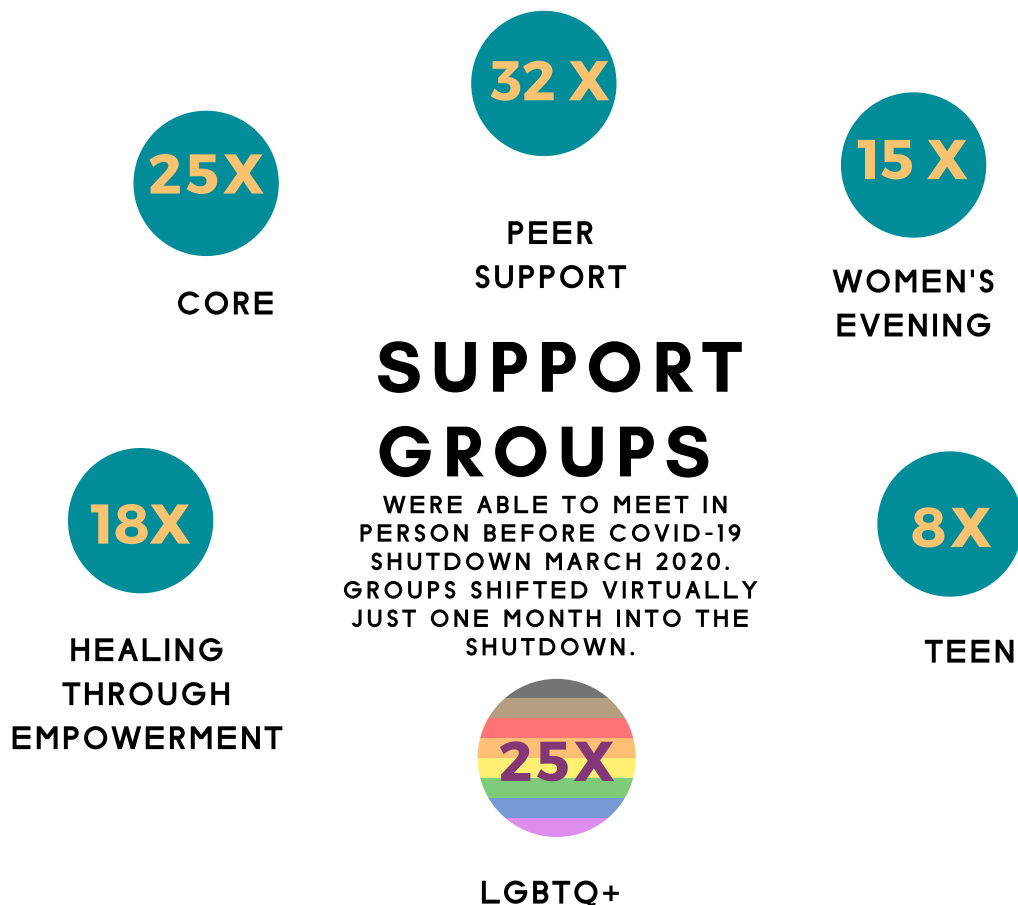
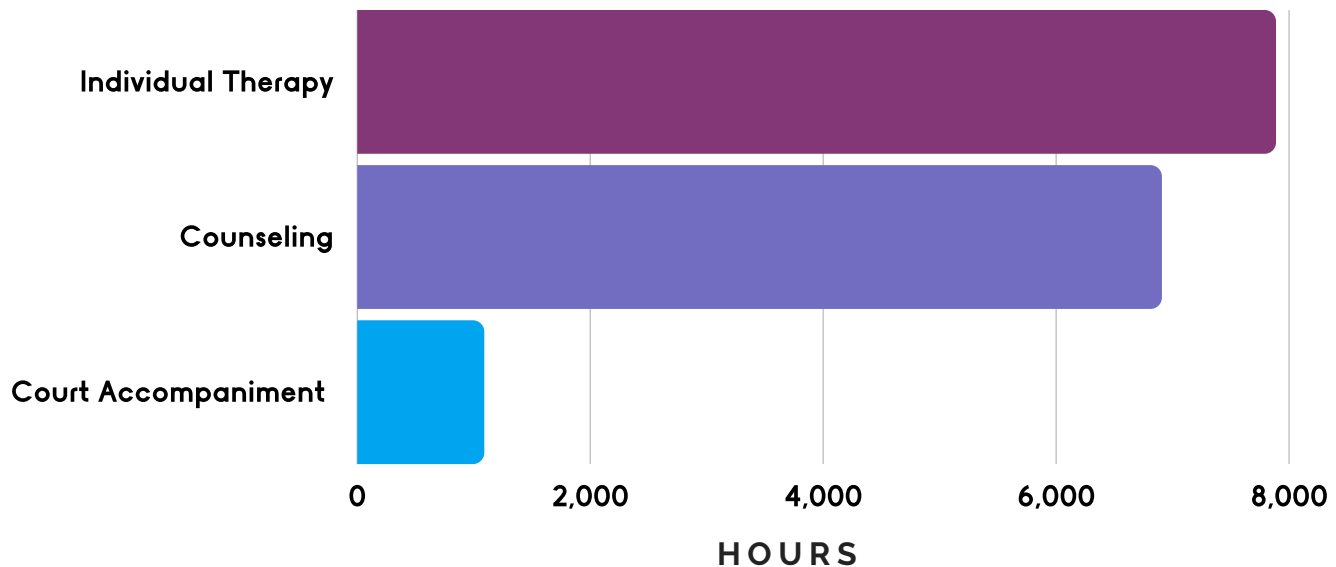

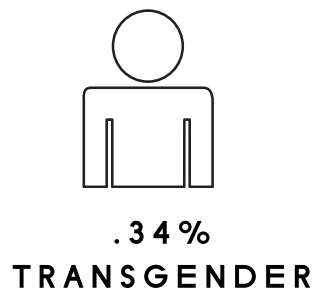
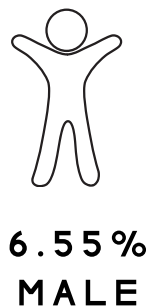
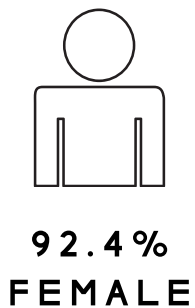
CRISIS DEPARTMENT

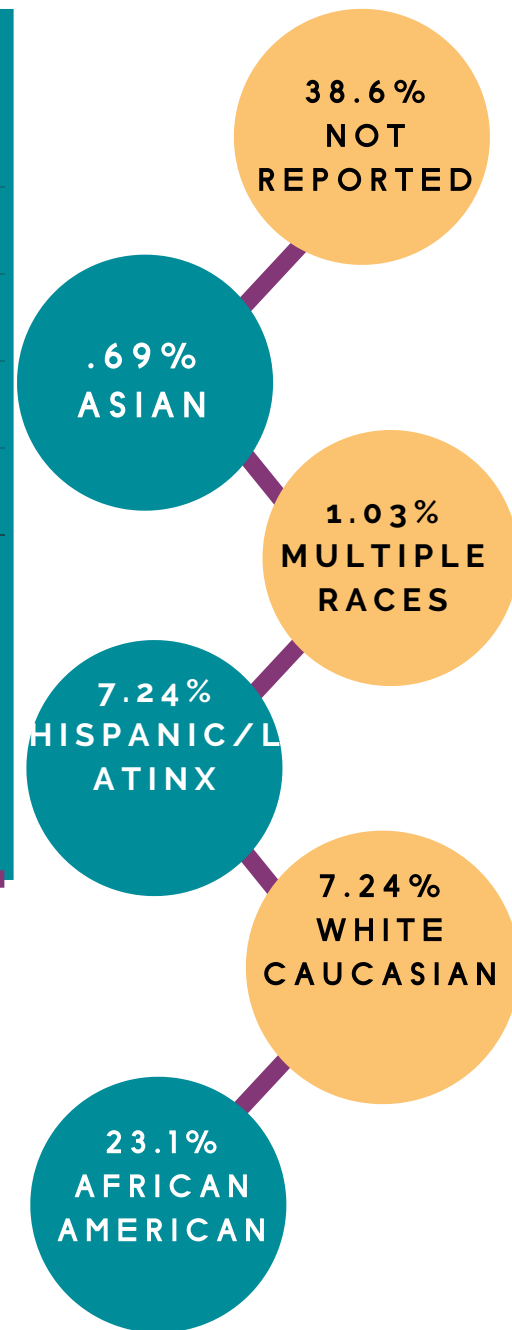
WOAR'S 24-HOUR HOTLINE RECEIVED 2,653 IN 2019- 2020

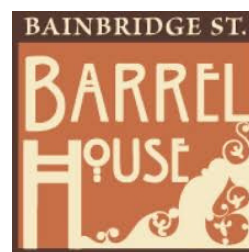

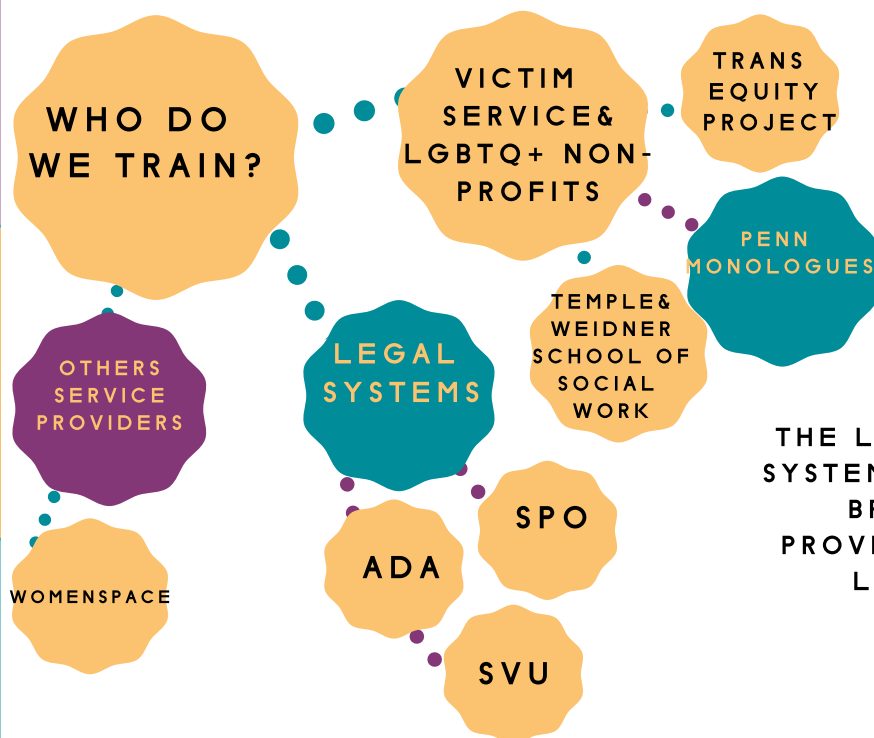

THE LOTUS.PROGRAM SEEKS TO COMBAT BARRIERS TO CARE AND INCREASE ACCESS TO SUPPORTIVE SERVICES. WOAR IS DOING THIS WORK BY BUILDING UP WOAR'S SERVICES TO BE LGBTQ+ AFFIRMING AS WELL AS TRAINING PROVIDERS IN THE CITY ABOUT THE INTERSECTION OF LGBTQ SEXUAL VIOLENCE.



THE LOTUS. PROGRAM IS WORKING ON A SYSTEMS ADVOCACY LEVEL TO CREATE A BROAD RESOURCE NETWORK OF PROVIDERS WHO ARE ABLE TO SUPPORT LGBTQ+ SURVIVORS OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE.

LGBTQ SEXUAL VIOLENCE SUPPORT GROUP WHICH IS A CLOSED 10-12 WEEK GROUP IS OPEN TO SURVIVORS OF ALL GENDERS.

HMI is a community mobilization program designed to provide opportunities for men to openly address issues of healthy relationships, traditional male gender norms, and their relationship to rape culture and sexual violence. HMI will act as a resource for men who have been victims of sexual abuse and are committed to healing. The primary focus is to align more men as allies against sexual violence while pursuing a holistic, healthier version of masculinity.

INCREASE EMOTIONAL LITERACY, SELF-CONTROL, AND EMPATHY TO ACTIVATE MEN TO PURSUE A MORE HOLISTIC VERSION OF MASCULINITY, CREATING CHANGE AGENTS AND AMBASSADORS OF HEALTHY MASCULINITY.
